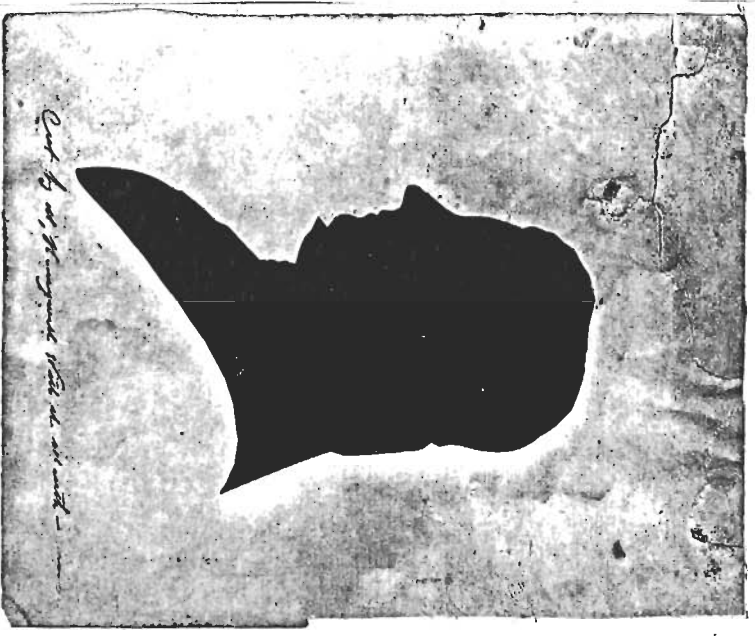
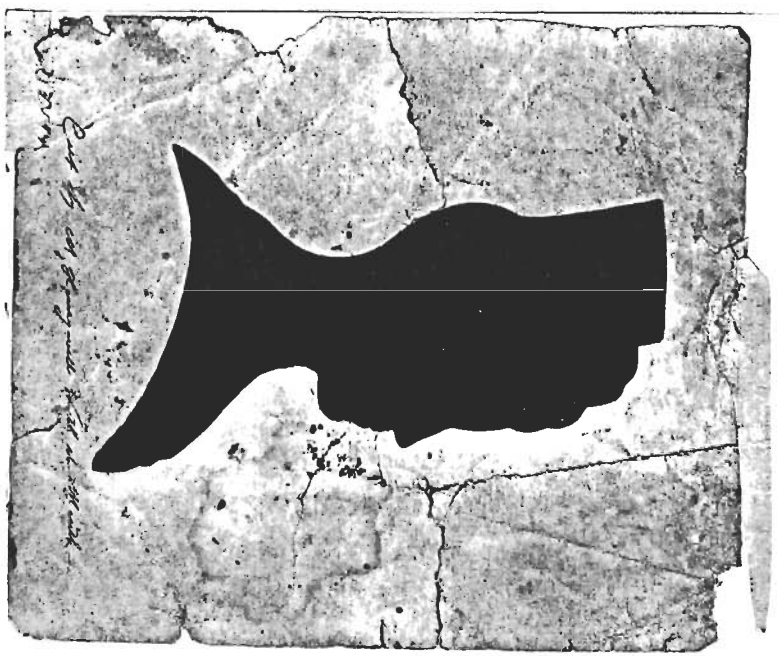


Sorry I do not have a likeness of Mrs. D.J. Brooks, the original I leave in a frame

Three silhouettes were cut at ca. fair in Brooklyn when granddaughter Eliz. Thompson was in N.Y. & visiting her grand parents James Daniel Brooks & Hannah (Sr.) — Brooks, Eliz.'s parents. Wm. Thompson & Hannah Brooks Thompson were in an area with poor schools. Daughter Eliz. was writing such poorly spelled and grammatically in correct letters to them in N.Y., they had been live with them for a year to get an education. When she was 15 in the 1830's they went to the fair and their silhouettes were cut by a famous silhouettist "M. Honeywell" who was armless. The black paper was held by their toes while she operated, pictures attached to a board by her mouth.
