Dear Mr. Howell: Clark Johnson at the Troup County Archives has shared with me your e-mail of May 25.

I do enjoy family research and inherited that love from both of my parents.

My grandmother on my mother's side was Julia Howell Marchman. She was the daughter of Mary Antoinette Parrot and Alonzo Howell. They married in 1860. His father was JOHN Johnson Howell, born in 1810, who married Elmina McBride in Perry, Georgia in 1832. My records show that he died in 1858 and she died in 1882.

His father was JOHN McKenney Howell who married Mary Johnson. They lived at Mecklenburg, N.C.; later in York, S.C. before coming to Georgia I have no dates on them at this time. I do know they had three children- John Johnson Howell, Matthew Howell, and Mary Howell.


My grandmother had researched all of this .
